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Trinity Academy Meadow View offers one rigorous curriculum that is taken by all students. Although Trinity Academy does not offer AP or IB, its coursework exceeds the Department of Education’s highest rating for rigor. For this reason, all graded high school courses are considered Honors Courses, with the exception of our dual enrollment courses, which carry college credit through Batten University.

Projects, Orals, and the World Issues course are evaluated on a pass/fail basis, with a high pass designated for excellent work.

Humanities Humane Letters* is a four-year course that integrates history, literature, philosophy, and writing through reading, discussion, and analytical writing. Each year emphasizes a different tradition—American, European, Greek, and Medieval/Modern—while students produce about 30 analytical essays and several major research papers. All students spend two periods in Humane Letters every day in grades 9-12.

Science and Math All students spend one hour in math and one hour in science each day. Calculus and computer programming are integrated into all junior and senior coursework.

Fine Arts Every student studies music theory, sings in a choir, and composes music. Every student studies studio art and creates a number of original works in a variety of media, including charcoal, watercolor, and acrylics. Every student performs in two full-length plays.

Trinity Academy is the **only high school in Virginia** to win this award three times.



Humane Letters is an interdisciplinary course that meets for two periods each day. The credits are broken down as follows:

- Honors Humane Letters I**

 - American History = 2 credits
 - Literature = 2 credits
 - Writing = 1 credit
- Honors Humane Letters II**

 - European History = 2 credits
 - Literature = 2 credits
 - Writing = 1 credit
- DE Humane Letters III**

 - Ancient & Classical Literature = 2 credits
 - Philosophy = 2 credits
 - Writing = 1 credit
- DE Humane Letters IV**

 - Medieval & Modern Literature = 2 credits
 - Philosophy = 2 credits

Dual Enrollment (DE) Courses:
Beginning in fall 2026, Batten University (formerly Virginia Wesleyan University) will offer college credit for the Trinity courses listed below through a dual enrollment program. All students take these courses as part of their regular Trinity schedule, but students may choose to pay the fee to receive college credit. Students who enroll will submit their Batten transcript separately.

Trinity Academy Meadow View is located in Falls Church, Virginia, and draws students primarily from the western suburbs of the Washington, D.C., metropolitan area. The school changed its name from Trinity School at Meadow View in August 2025.

Trinity Academy is a community of learners characterized by the rigorous exploration of reality, the disciplined exchange of ideas, and active participation in the fine arts. Trinity Academy’s educational approach calls students to engage directly and meaningfully in the work of learning. GRADING SYSTEM

Trinity Academy emphasizes written feedback and narrative reports over letter grades, while still providing parents with traditional transcripts each semester. The grading scale follows the normal, unweighted 4.0 system, with the addition of an A+ for exceptional work.

Trinity Academy assigns credits to semester-long courses of study. A graduate of the set curriculum is required to complete 52 credits. Since a standard high school diploma requirement is approximately 24 credits, the 1 credit allotment on this transcript is the equivalent of 0.5 credit.

CLASS RANK

Due to the small size of classes and curriculum rigor, class rank would be misleading in most cases. Therefore, Trinity Academy does not rank students.
